## How to Win By Chaplain Lee Alphen

Thirty-seven horses died at Santa Anita during the 2019 racing season. We knew trouble was brewing as the media stepped up its coverage and more intense investigations began. Yet some high profile trainers, owners and veterinarians never expected their doping schemes to be exposed. Many in the industry knew this was happening but did not know how to stop it. Not wanting to drug his horses, and tired of the skewed playing field, a good friend stopped training horses several years ago. I'm sure others have left the business for the same reason.

Dave Briggs has it right in his February 13 Harness Racing Update article, "Judgement Day is Upon Us". As of that date, four harness trainers were among the 28 Thoroughbred and Standardbred horsemen indicted. The number of indictments continues to grow.

King Solomon went against God's command, marrying foreign wives and taking concubines from nations who worshipped other gods. Solomon even had shrines built to these false gods and offered sacrifices himself (1 Kings 11:1-

God allowed King Nebuchadnezzar to exile first Israel and later Judea to Babylon because God's people "did what was evil in the sight of the Lord" (2Kgs 23:32 et al). The Israelites knew they would be blessed for doing as God commanded, "See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse: the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today; and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn from the

way that I am commanding you today, to follow other gods" (Deuteronomy 11:26-28).

After 70 years in exile, King Cyrus allowed the Israelites to return to Jerusalem to rebuild God's temple. However, soon after they began construction, they succumbed to pressure from their pagan neighbors and halted their work, disobeying the command of God (2 Chronicles 36:23; Ezra 4).

Sometime later, after a severe drought dried up crops and water sources, causing widespread famine, the people finally turned to God. They listened as God spoke through the prophets Haggai and Zechariah, chastising them for living the good life in nice houses and enjoying good food and wine while the temple lay in ruins (Haggai 1:1-11).

As they again took up the construction of the temple, the rains came. When challenged again by their neighbors and the local government, they chose to listen to and continue to follow God. Then God told them what to say to plead their case. The Babylonian government backed them up and even commanded the local government to provide the resources. God provided (Ezra 5-6).

Harness racing has had many wakeup calls already. How will we respond to this one? Is it too late to turn things around? What ideas might God have for us? I am sure there are some. Will we seek God's will? Are we ready to listen to the advice of the One who has our best interests at heart? Or will we continue to worship drugs and other forms of race-fixing and animal abuse?

God blessed us with beautiful horses that we love and provided a way for us to enjoy them





He trained horses for more than 40 years, racing stables in New York and New Jersey. Mr. Brennan was on the board of the SOA of New York for more than 30 years and an HHI delegate for more than 20 years. At the time of his death, he was the horsemen's representative at Yonkers Raceway.


Daniel W Camac, 83, died Feb 10. After his service, in the US

Army, Daniel became a Dover police officer and a graduate of the FBI Academy. He was a longtime owner, trainer, driver and breeder, managing the family stable with his wife, Flo, on their farm in Magnolia, DE. He was very active in horsemen's politics. As one of the founding directors of DSOA, Daniel was part of a core group of directors who



**Rita Fusco-Jackson**, 55, of NJ, died March 13 from the Coronavirus. She was a religious education teacher at Co-Cathedral of St. Robert Bellarmine. Her brothers Carmine and Vinnie Fusco and mother, Grace Fusco also died of the Coronavirus.

Carmine Fusco died March 18 from the Coronavirus. He was Rita and Vinnie Fusco's brother and a New York and New Jersey-based trainer. Carmine trained about 20 horses in in Wind Gap, PA, where he co-owned a training center.



**Grace Fusco**, 73 also died March 18 of Coronavirus. She was the mother of Carmine, Rita and Vinnie.

**Vinnie Fusco,** 53, of Manalapn, NJ, died March 18. Seven members of Vinnie's family were hospitalized with Coronavirus. As listed above, his sister brother and mother also succumbed. He was an owner, trainer and driver.

George D Harp, 89, of Vernon, NY, died March 14.

George was honorably discharged from the US Army after receiving the Purple Heart and Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster. George's passion was harness racing. He trained and drove some standout horses. As a result of his successful racing career, he was inducted into Florida Harness Horse Hall of Fame. He attended the Vernon Methodist Church. Two of his



sons, Ron and Richard, race in NY. His brother, Warren, a life-long owner, trainer, driver, trained at Glicrest Training Center.

Hal H. Hewitt, 82, died March 23. Hal, a 1960 graduate of Michigan Tech,. was a Mechanical Engineer for Clark for 32 years and owned Standardbred horses for 17 years.



**Richard M. "Dick" Neville**, 75, of Mt Sterling, OH, died March 24. Dick was a longtime farrier who plied his trade for more than 60 years from Indiana to Ohio to Florida. He began shoeing his own ponies at the age of 14. He reached the pinnacle of his profession as he worked with some of the greatest horses in harness racing, many of which are enshrined in the Hall of Fame.

**Eclee "Chubby" Scott**, 74, died March 14. He was a resident of Yonkers, NY, at the time of his death. Eclee was a harness trainer. In later years worked as a caretaker for trainer Mike Forte.

Joseph E. Sullivan III, 68, of Swanzey, NH, died Nov 12. After working in the family business, Sullivan Brothers Printers, one of the country's largest sports printing firms, he began a long career in the pari-mutuel racing industry at Rockingham Park. He later went on to manage Foxboro Racetrack and was the longtime owner and operator of Hinsdale Greyhound Park. However, he



found his true calling in recent years through his work as a direct support provider with Chesco, Inc., which provides services to those with disabilities. He cared deeply about every one of his

clients and had recently been nominated for direct support person of the year for the Monadnock Region.

**Richard "Rich" Allen Wagers**, 77, died Feb 23. Rich worked as a manager of Pickwick Farms for many years. He loved training and working with racehorses. He was a member of Moreland Methodist Church.

John Francis Wayne, 65, of Egg Harbor Township, NJ, died Feb 26. John grew up around racing and worked part time for the New York Racing Association (NYRA). He was hired as a TRPB (Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau) detective in 1976, in 1978 became a TRPB agent and was Lead Investigator at 28 of the top tracks in the United States and Canada. He also headed Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Racing Circuit security at Churchill Downs. In 1999, John was appointed Executive Director of the Thoroughbred Racing and Harness Racing Commissions for the State of Delaware.

**Lindsay W. Wright**, 58, of Morton, IL, died March 1. After law school, he was a practicing attorney for several years before recognizing that his first passion was to teach history. He graduated from Illinois State University with a teaching certificate and he then taught at Morton High School. Lindsay was the son of Bill and Maddy Wright. They assure me he was a believer in the Lord, Jesus Christ.

Marc Aubin, 86, died February 28. He was so passionate about horses and fought to the end to live but was finally able to have the rest he deserved. Marc was a member of the FSBOA, USTA & Standardbred Canada and also a past FSBOA Board of Director. He was



inducted into the Florida Chapter United States Harness Writes Association and the 2012 Hall of Fame. He trained horses most of his life in Pompano Beach, FL.

**Frank J. Bellino**, 85, of Bronxville, NY, died March 17. Frank founded a successful construction firm and also owned commercial real estate throughout the United States. He started in the harness racing industry in 1982 and has owned a number of top pacers and trotters by himself and in partnership with his sons, Joe and George. "He loved harness racing more than any business he was ever involved with," said his son, Joe Bellino.

Warren Harp, 83, of Bell, FL, died March 28. Warren grew up in and remained in the harness racing industry his whole life. At 16, he drove his first pari-mutuel race for his father, George Harp Sr. At 19, he went on the Grand Circuit with noted trainer Harry Fitzpatrick to learn the ways of training Grand Circuit colts.



At 24, he went to work for Delvin Miller and drove some of his best horses at that time. In 1968 he opened a public stable in New England with his wife, Joan. Warren was an important part of the ministry at Rockingham Park. He received the Stanley Dancer Award from the Florida USHWA chapter and was inducted into the Florida Harness Racing Hall of Fame.
