Nickers and God's Voice By Chaplain Lee Alphen

Standing on the rail as the horses come down the stretch, you can hear drivers shouting and whistling to their horses. The horses listen and pick up the pace.

Jennifer Brown of the acclaimed Brian Brown Stables puts it this way, "Our horses nicker when they hear us, once they get to know our voices. They know who feeds and waters them and takes care of their boo-boos. They trust us."

I always look forward to visiting Jennifer and Brian and also Ron and Kila Steck at the Jug.

Kila says, "The horses get to know us. They recognize our voices when we talk to them in the barn or go to get them from the paddock. Marty Party Two is usually kind of a grouchy mare. However, she goes right to my partner, Amanda Allender, when she goes to visit her at Sugar Valley Farm. On the track, our horses know who makes them mind." Kila thinks they go a better training mile with Ron behind them than with someone else.

Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27). Do we listen and hear God's voice? While God has never come personally to speak with me, I do hear God "talk" to me through the scripture, listening to preachers, reading books and articles and even watching a good movie. Sometimes God even speaks through family members and friends.

Often, I pray on my daily walk. Outside, alone, focused on God with the rhythm of my steps, God speaks to my heart. If I was still jogging horses, I think that would be a perfect time for me to pray and listen for God's voice with the beat of hooves clanging on the stone dust track. It is easier to hear God when we listen.

"The Lord is good to those who wait for Him. He is good to those who look for Him. It is good to wait quietly, ... [to] sit alone and be

quiet" (Lamentations 3:25-26, 28 ERV). My guess is we are all good at

talking to God. We tell God what we want but then often leave the conversation before we hear God's answer. It is important to include listening in our prayer time. Sitting in the presence of God is generally a peaceful experience. Sometimes it is easier to stay focused by repeating a word such as "Jesus" or a short phrase from a psalm or other scripture passage.



God knows our needs even better than we know the needs of our horses. God does not come down from heaven wrapping twitches around our ears or sticking worming tubes down our noses. Rather, God gently nudges us.

Elijah the prophet was afraid when Jezebel threatened to kill him. He fled to the desert and begged God to take him. The Lord provided food and water and encouraged him to climb Mount Horeb, the Lord's mountain, and wait in

a cave for God. God did not speak in the high winds, the earthquake or the fire but later in a tiny whisper (1 Kings 19).

It is up to us to listen for the still small voice of God. Then, when we hear it, we must test it to make sure it is the Lord. A good test is to ask, "Is this something Jesus would say?" We the voice of God will never contradict the Word of God

may also ask God for confirmation. When we know in our heart that, yes, this is God's voice, we proceed and trust God with the outcome.

Our horses nicker and deliver when they hear our voices. Can we improve the way we listen and respond to the voice of God?

He enjoyed raising cattle. Bill had served as an escort for numerous Honor Guard, Inc. flights that transport U.S. military veterans



to Washington, D.C. to see the memorial of the respective war in which they fought.

Joseph A. DeFrank Jr. (DeFrancesco), 87, of Lake

Pleasant, NY, died Dec 12. In 1956 he began his career in racing as an assistant in the Hilliard Raceway race office. His career took him to the race offices at many other tracks in the United States and Canada. He was hired by the late Delvin Miller to help start The Meadows in 1963. Then, in

1976, he accepted a position as director of racing for the newly built Meadowlands. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1994.

Frank A. Glasso, 98, of Rome NY, died Nov 5. Frank was a member of the USHWA for 55 years and an USHWA Director for 16 years. He was a reporter and photographer at the Rome Daily Sentinel. Frank was cited by the Associated Press for his reporting on a major storm in the central New York area. He also wrote

about the trotters and pacers at Vernon Downs and avidly followed harness racing.

Betty Jean Goveia, 82, died Nov 21. Betty owned trained and drove harness horses. She raced at Batavia Downs. She loved going to flea markets, craft shows, doing crafts herself and her dogs.



Providence Forge, VA, died Dec 13. Ron's love for animals

led him to Standardbred race horses including owning, breeding, training and driving many of his favorite horses to the winner's circle. He was a self-employed concrete worker by trade and owneroperator of Canuck Construction.

Tresa "Teri" Lynn Miller, 61, of

Delaware, OH, died Dec 7. Teri had a zest for life that kept

her working with people less fortunate than herself. Her current job at Delaware-Morrow COVA was a continuation of her passion for the mentally and physically challenged in the Delaware area. Teri's other passions in life were the Little Brown



Jug and The Ohio State Buckeyes.

Rosanne Owens, 60, of Greenville, OH, and formerly of Oakhurst, NJ, died Dec 7. Rosanne was employed as a professional assistant at the Adams Physical Therapy Services of Winchester, IN, Also with her husband, Mel, she was very active in Standardbred racing. She was an owner. Mel continues to own and train harness horses. **Ronald E. Ralph**, 91, of Waldoboro, ME



died Nov 24. Ron and his sister, Helen, owned Ralph Chevrolet for 40-plus years. As an avid harness racing fan and owner, Ron was president of Lewiston Raceway for over 20 years and a director of the New England division of the USTA for over 50 years. He was voted to the New England Horsemen Hall of Fame in 2011.

Jerry Lynn Roberts, 79, of South Vienna, OH, died Dec 18. Jerry was a United States Navy veteran who worked and retired from Navistar in Springfield. He was a Standardbred driver/trainer who loved his horses.

William 'Bill' Robinson, 74, of Caledonia, Ont, died Dec 11. Bill got involved with racing after going in on a \$1,500

claiming horse with a bunch of friends while working at a local Firestone factory. He eventually quit working at the factory to become a trainer and enjoyed tremendous success. Several horses he trained were inducted into the Hall of Fame and won many divisional honors in Canada like the O'Brien Award.



Hilary Lynn Spears, 37, died Nov 21. Hillary was the much beloved daughter of Drs. Laura and Paul "Pete" Spears. She earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts majoring in photography from the University of the Arts, Philadelphia, PA. Hilary was a talented photographer with a keen eye for portraits which revealed a great deal about her subjects. She charted a fiercely independent path during her life, following it uncompromisingly despite obstacles and personal setbacks.

Evelyn Mae Walters, 93, of Delaware, OH, died Nov 24. Evelyn and her husband, Dr. Dale Walters operated his Veterinary business and established Sugar Valley farm. She especially enjoyed assisting in the foaling of their horses and watching their horses race. She was a staple at her Jug Week box at the Delaware County Fair for years. Her favorite past time of all was mowing her grass in which she did until she was 91. She was a member of the Old Stone Presbyterian Church.

Michael Scott Weiner, 55, of Monticello, NY, died Dec 26. Michael had a lifetime of success on the track as an owner, trainer and amateur driver. His final win as an owner came Dec 23, 2020, in the ninth race at Monticello with his own KJ Brent.
