Working for God By Chaplain Lee Alphen

Happy birthday to the horses! Happy New Year to you and yours! What does 2023 have in store for us anyway? Will it be much different than 2022 or more of the same?

The horses will likely continue doing what horses do. Sometimes they are training and racing and other times kicking their heels up in the pasture and maybe socializing with their equine friends. Of course, they still count on the humans to provide their food and water and their other needs.

Remember, we have all been entrusted with a mission by God and, as believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, much is expected of us. "You are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19 NKJV).

We saw recently all that was expected of the royal household and nobility in Great Britain with the activity surrounding the queen's death. As members of the household of God, some of the expectations placed on us are similar and others are different. Like the nobility, we are expected to show kindness and always care for people with love and respect and to be honest, generous and courageous. Yet we are welcome to wear our barn clothes or whatever else we want and to pretty much come and go as we please instead of adhering to more rigid royal customs. John Otrembiak, 76, died October 26. When asked what he thought about his situation, John said he was "excited


