Yes or No

Yes! Your horse won the elimination and drew the rail in the Hambletonian. Will you drive my horse in the Little Brown Jug? Yes! Your parents are struggling and can't afford basic necessities. Do you want to help them? Yes, of course. Your groom needs a day off for an important medical appointment. Yes, by all means, go.

God sent an angel to Mary to tell her God wanted her to become the mother of His son. Jesus. Mary said Yes as soon as she realized it was God's will.

Joseph was troubled. He loved Mary and surely trusted her. However, the law required since Mary was a pregnant, unmarried woman, that he should divorce her and that she be stoned to death.

Some theologians say that, because Joseph was a humble man, he did not feel adequate to raise the Son of God. Whatever the case, when the angel came to him in a dream, telling him not to be afraid to marry Mary, he said, yes because he finally realized it was God's will.

He said, 'Look! I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods.'

Abednego, servants of the Most High God, come out! Come here!' So Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego came out of the fire, and the satraps, prefects, governors and royal advisers crowded around them. They saw that the fire had not harmed their bodies, nor was a hair of their heads singed; their robes were not scorched, and there was no smell of fire on them.

"Then Nebuchadnezzar said, 'Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants! They trusted in him and defied the king's command and were willing to give up their lives rather than serve or worship any god except their own God" (Daniel 3:24-28 NIV).

The king then made a ruling against anyone who said anything against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego (Daniel 3:29 NIV). With this Nebuchadnezzar agreed with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego and said yes to our God as the only true God.

The devil tempted Jesus three times in the desert. Each time Jesus said no. Finally the devil left him alone.

After Jesus was arrested, Peter was asked three different times if he knew Jesus. All three times Peter said no. This makes us sad. We wish he had been strong enough to say yes and stand up for Jesus. Later Peter was sorry he said no.

The more we spend time speaking with God and listening for God's answers deep in our hearts, studying the scriptures, and growing in relationship with God, the better we will understand God's will for us. Then we will better know when the correct answer is "Yes" and when it is "No" so that we too can reach our full potential and become everything God made us to be.

Timothy Earl Dunlap, 65, formerly of Batavia, NY, died Feb 20. Timothy was a longtime Standardbred horseman. "My father's specialty was breaking yearlings; he had a great knack for it; he had the patience for it," said his son , Cody. "I remember as a young child traveling around New York state to all the fairs with him and watching him race. He was an amazing teacher as well. He had his own stable in Alden (NY); at any given time, he always had 15 horses racing at Batavia, Buffalo, Vernon, Monticello, and Yonkers. And he went up to Canada quite a few times as well."

Fred A. Huff, 94, of Du Quoin, IL, died March 18. Fred was publicity director of the Du Quoin State Fair and later assumed overall management of Hayes Fair Acres and the Fair's annual exposition and celebrity showcase. He was a writer, historian and promoter of Southern Illinois athletics and entertainment. For over 35 years, he distinguished Southern Illinois University



and its Salukis as one of the nation's most recognized athletic programs. Fred is the author of "The Hambletonian – 1926-1975" and "The History of the Du Quoin State Fair (1923-2002)".

Pacey "The Wizard" Mindlin, 81, of Franklin, Ohio, died March 7. Pacey was introduced nightly by sidekick Barry Vicroy at Miami Valley Raceway as "the world's greatest handicapper." Pacey offered listeners insight, humor and selections in his own inimitable style. "He was the face of racing at Miami Valley," said Director of Racing Ken Rambo. "He had a legion of fans throughout the harness racing world and even those that thought his antics were a bit too unconventional tuned in to watch him. He will be missed." He has been around the track all his life and owned and bred horses, many good horses. **Alvin Earl Parkes**, 75, of Draper, VA, formerly of


Lewisburg, WV, died Dec 10. Throughout his life, Earl took great joy in breeding, raising and racing harness horses. After serving in the US Air Force, he touched many lives throughout his career as a Nurse Anesthetist. He enjoyed farming, spending time with family, and a good hymn-sing. Earl was a CHHA member.



Chris Patterson, 70, of Cambridge, OH, died Nov 15. Chris was an announcer in Ohio since the early 1970's. He called races at Scioto Downs for a while and at many of the county fairs in Ohio. In the summer preceding his death, he called races at 13 county fairs even though his health was declining. His energetic style will be remembered throughout the Buckeye State and especially his spots between races promoting the breeding farms and other companies within the industry. Chris died with no family and is buried in an unmarked grave. Lisa Schwartz is organizing a fundraiser for a cemetery marker.

Salvatore Reale, 80, of Pittsburgh, PA, died March 7. Salvatore took pride in racing and breeding Standardbreds. When he first came to America, he was a tailor and later became a successful business owner of the Villa Reale Pizzeria.



Sara Frances Short, 88, died Feb 20. Sara worked for the USTA for 50 years. She loved working in her father's stable, The Forrest Short racing stable. Sara helped at Scioto Downs as part of a group of ladies called Sulky Sweeties and also helped with the horse races at the Pickaway County Fair. She also volunteered at Riverside Methodist

Hospital and was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church and an usher.

Salvatore Sparacino, 87, of Westbury, NY, died March 7. Salvatore was a veteran of Roosevelt Raceway. He was a trainer, driver and breeder.



Edward Eugene Telle, 76, of Orlando, FL, died March 17. Ed loved and was passionate about horse racing. He was an owner and trainer of Standardbreds and in the past owned Thoroughbreds.
