Donald A. Filomeno, 82, of Cicero, IL, died April 1. Donald was an owner, trainer, driver and breeder for over 50 years. He trained horses through the end of 2020 and last donned his white, red and light blue colors to drive a race in 1996. He was a member of St. Odilo Catholic Church. **Wilma Foley**, 66, of Prestonsburg, KY, died April 14. Wilma was a long-time harness horse owner and trainer. She served as Operations Director of Thunder Ridge Raceway in Prestonsburg, KY until it closed. She and her business partner, Lawrence Cooper, campaigned around the country for 23 years.





Mike Harding, 76, died March 31. Mike was a longtime horse owner, trainer, driver and head of the Florida Standardbred Breeders Association. He was inducted into the Michigan Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2017. He was the starting quarterback his senior year at Hillsdale College. Then he was the quarterback for the semi-pro Flint Wildcats. He also played amateur baseball and officiated football, baseball, softball, and wrestling. **Charles J. Johnston**, 87, of Dupont, PA, died March 30.

Charles owned, trained and drove

Standardbreds on the New England circuit before moving to Pocono Downs. After completing his service in the US Air Force, Charles managed and supervised underground networks throughout New England for AT&T. He was raised in a very religious family and developed a profound

love for God, which continued throughout his life. He loved to share stories about his beliefs and would often be heard speaking of God or reminding those around him to "Look up and say thank you!"

Barbara Jean Kinsey, 87, of Clayton, DE, died March 24.

Barbara was a farmer's wife for many years and then a seamstress. In the 1970's she started working the racetracks in Delaware as a mutual clerk and line supervisor until her retirement. The most important thing in her life was her love of God, family, and friends. She was a member of Smyrna

Wesleyan Church where she volunteered in many positions. Barbara was a CHHA member and CHHA member, Sandy Thorstenson's, mother.

Margareta Wallenius-Kleberg, 85, died April 14.

Margareta was an ambassador for the sport of harness racing on both sides of the Atlantic. She was a member of the board of directors of the Hambletonian Society, owner of the Stoner Creek Farm in Kentucky, and a breeder and owner. She was the main owner of the Walleniusrederierna, a Swedish shipping company founded by her father.



Jim D. Mace, 90, of Washington Court House, OH, died April 4. Jim spent many years training and driving Standardbreds throughout Ohio and the east coast. He also owned and operated M&M Turf Supply in Washington Court House and Scioto Downs.



He enjoyed fishing, raising and breeding horses, and harness racing.

Chad Philip Moore, 46, of Washington CH, OH, died April 17. Chad had a passion for training Standardbreds and was actively involved in the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, USTA, and the Fayette County Harness Horsemen's Association. He was a certified diesel technician at Penske Truck Rental. He enjoyed volunteering his time to help kids in 4-H clubs.



Efstratios Thomas Nikitas, 81, of Geneva, FL, died

March 27. He was a great auto mechanic in his early years as well as a Standardbred owner, trainer and driver, campaigning his stable throughout the Midwest, New England, and Florida. He branched out into the tack business and eventually created Rich Tack manufacturing harnesses.



Thomas Sullivan, 80, of Anderson, IN, died

recently. Thomas spent five years studying for the ministry before embarking on a career with harness racing. He worked for a vet in California. In the 1990's, he moved to Indiana and worked for a vet at Hoosier Park who also trained horses. Later he worked for other trainers. Thomas was part of Chaplain Claudean Webb's ministry at Hoosier and attended chapel service. Chaplain Claudean said he was a wonderful man, "He would help anyone who needed help around the track and was an all-around good feller."



When you see the Longshot Stables horses racing, cheer them on. Ken Wood of Longshot Stables and cofounder of Lifetime Wells International travels to Africa several times a year to drill wells and bring medical teams to perform eye surgeries.

To date they have drilled over 3,100 wells providing clean water to many communities. They also facilitated over 10,000 eye surgeries making the blind to see; fitted over 28,000 people

with eyeglasses and helped almost 62,000 others with treatments for eye infections and other eye problems. His horse's earnings help fund these projects.
