Mary Bernadette "Bernie' MacArthur, 94, died May

31. When she was 26, Bernie took over her first husband's photography business when he died. She and her new husband, Ron, continued to run the business and were also involved in harness racing. They eventually developed a broodmare farm in Clinton. While being a fun place for family and friends, Bermac Farm made a significant contribution to improving the breeding stock in the



Maritimes. Later they turned the photography business over to their sons and began racing horses full time in the United States and Canada.

Paul Anthony McKinnon, 93, of Charlottetown and formerly of Clyde River, PEI, died May 25. Paul proudly served in the Canadian Armed Forces in Canada and Germany. Later he became the Charlottetown Airport Fire Chief and purchased Skyeglen Farm in Clyde River. At the farm, his love of horses and the harness racing industry flourished. He became a director of the USTA and remained a Director Emeritus until his passing. Paul was a member of St. Francis of Accient particle

a member of St. Francis of Assisi parish.

Pierre-Luc Quimper, 39, of Palm Beach, FL, died June 12. Pierre and his best friend, Michael Cote Gagnon, launched One Legend Stable Inc., which had great success in its first year. It has several young horses in training under the care of Jennifer Bongiorno and Julie Miller. Pierre was the ex-president and co-founder of Bitfarm Inc.



Peter "Rocky" Roccasano, 89, of Pittsburgh, PA died June 24. Rocky claimed his first horse, Who Du Girl, at Wheeling Downs Raceway in the early 1970s for his daughter, harness racing owner/breeders and author, Victoria (Howard). He built a half-mile racetrack at his "Rock-A-Bye Farms" in Pittsburgh and stood his own stallion. He raced his horses mainly at The Meadows. Rocky also fought for his country in the Korean War.

Marion Lois Simpson, 81, of Maitland, FL, died June 6. Lois was always there at the racetrack with her husband, John Simpson, Jr, rooting him on to the winner's circle. She also watched all of her grandchildren at their numerous sporting events through middle school and high school. She was a loving wife, mother and grandmother. Anyone that was fortunate enough to meet her would always say that she was a special person.

James Thomas "Tom" Sweeney Jr, 88, of Hadley, MI,

died May 24. Tom and his wife, Phyllis, owned and operated gas stations where they eventually began selling homemade bread. He was a lifetime farmer and after "retiring" from the bakery business, Tom went full time owning, training and driving Standardbreds. He was a Golden Glove Champion in 1952 and was known as the "Metamora Plow Boy."



Beryl C. Taylor, VMD, 73, of Cream Ridge, NJ, died May

23. Dr. Beryl was an equine veterinarian who cared for generations of brood mares and foals that went on to race at tracks around the world. After graduating first in his class from vet school as Valedictorian he joined the Walnridge Equine Clinic in Cream Ridge, NJ for a short time before starting his own practice. Beryl was a familiar

sight driving the roads in and around Cream Ridge with a passel of dogs riding shotgun in SUVs. Off duty, Beryl spent hours on the phone with clients who had become

friends, talking them through the care of their small animals.

Waylon Eugene Winters, 4, of

Washington Court House, OH, died May 30. Waylon's parents, Mark and Candace, race in Ohio. According to the family, "Waylon had a personality that was bigger than life. Though his time here was short, the love and enjoyment he shared with others will last forever."



Virginia "Ginger" Pack Young, 87, died May 21. Ginger was a breeder, owner, trainer and race official and one of the first "Starfish" participants. She began her career as a racing official at Delmarva Downs then served as paddock judge at Harrington and Dover Downs and was often a substitute at Ocean Downs and Rosecroft in several capacities. When the USTA began the "Starfish" rehoming program for Standardbreds found in kill pens, Ginger was the first volunteer to help with the rehabbing.



The Praise Privilege By Chaplain Sam Spence

We are in a spiritual battle. The Apostle Paul makes this very clear in the statements below that he wrote to the church at Corinth, as well as those he scribed to the church at



Ephesus: "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." (*Ephesians 6:12*)

Paul goes on to explain putting on the whole armor of God, which includes your waist girded with truth, the breastplate of righteousness, feet shod with preparation of the gospel of peace, shield of faith, helmet of salvation, sword of the spirit (God's Word), and praying in the spirit.

One weapon – actually a vehicle – which incorporates our full armor is *praise*; it can be one of the most effective ways of putting the enemy on the run..."Resist the devil and he will flee from you." *(James 4:7)* Resist is an active verb, not a passive one. When we begin to praise the Lord in the midst of a trial, temptation, or contrary circumstance, we (in football terms) suddenly take an *offensive* position rather than a *defensive* one. And continual praise will take us right into the end zone for a score!

Every prayer we utter should begin with praise and thanks. There's something about praise that not only evokes the angels of God into action on our behalf, but activates the forces of faith, hope, and joy on the inside of us.

Praise is a powerful privilege at our complete command. Don't neglect it.

Scripture:

For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ. (2 Corinthians 10:3-5).
