### **Bond With God**

Cristina Zenato has removed over 300 hooks from the mouths of sharks over the last 25 years. According to a recent report in **The Epoch Times**, the sharks have come to know and love her. They show their appreciation by bringing their shark friends to meet her and putting their heads in her lap.

After a mare foals, she licks the baby clean and continues to lick and groom her offspring as they grow. Cats do this too. This helps them to bond. Some of my horses bonded with me by putting their heads on my shoulder or playfully biting my hair.

The best way to bond with God is by thanking Him for all our blessings. King David, whom God called a man after His own heart, said, "I will praise the Lord at all times. I will never stop singing His praises" (Psalm 34:1 ERV).

Paul said, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 NIV) and "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7 NIV).

Ah, yes, the peace of God is awesome! When we pray by thanking God and praising Him for all our blessings, God's peace comes over us, sending anxiety away. Then, as we continue to communicate with God, we are better able to understand where we need God's help.

Jesus said, "Whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and

they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son" (John 14:12-13 NIV).

Remember, Jesus lives in every believer. It is through His Spirit living in us that we can do great things in His name. Jesus said, "If anyone says to this mountain, 'Go, throw yourself into the sea,' and does not doubt in their heart but believes that what they say will happen, it will be done for them. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours" (Mark 11:23-24 NIV).

Now, of course, when we are in constant communication with God, praising His name and thanking Him for our blessings, the things we ask for will not be against God's will.

Cristina and the sharks built up a system of communication so they understood each other and grew in trust. This trust and camaraderie blessed Cristina and the sharks. Foals learn to trust their mares, and, as they grow, they trust that their caretakers want the best for them. These special relationships bless the horses and the caretakers.

In the same way, as we grow to trust God's word, we are better able to step out in faith. Notice that the passage from Mark doesn't say to just ask God to move the mountain. Rather, after praying to know God's will and thanking Him for our many blessings, we are to step out in faith, speaking in the name of Jesus against any obstacle that is against what we know God wants for us. The stronger our faith, the faster our mountains will crumble.

Alan Ray Bowen, 77, of Mt. Sterling, IL, died Nov 1. Alan owned and operated Bowen Stables at the Brown County Fairgrounds for over 55 years. He bred, trained and raced Standardbreds at many county fairs and pari-mutuel tracks. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Mt. Sterling.

Lorraine Cunningham, 76, of Warwick, NY, died Oct 31.

Lorraine dedicated her life to the well-being and happiness of those around her. She was married to Standardbred racing participant Thomas Cunningham for 52 years, and together they fostered a home filled with love, laughter and unwavering support.



Jean B. Emerson, 93, of Saco, ME, died Nov 18. Jean bred, trained and raced Standardbred horses. She and her husband, Chet, had a breeding farm in Saco. She was also the

founder of the very successful harness racing publication *Northeast Harness News*. She was member of the United States Harness Writers Association's New England chapter and helped establish the

Florida chapter where she held leadership roles.

Betty Jean (Coe) Hanners, 83, of Washington CH, OH, died Oct 30. Jeannie was born into the horse business, and it continued to be the most important joy in her life. She especially took pride in her four grandsons driving and winning races nightly. She worked for Mac Tools in Washington CH for over 20 years.

Edward Donald James, 92, of Aurora, OH, died Oct 29. Edward owned Standardbreds for more than 65 years including U.S. and Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee McWicked under his S S G Stables. Ed never completed 10th grade yet he became the national sales manager and president of two different multi-national companies.

**Norah McDermott**, 91, of Toms River, NJ, originally from Ireland, died Nov 7. She loved horse racing and followed her sons, John and Kevin's, careers in harness racing. She worked for the NJ Meadowlands Commission for seventeen years before retiring in 1997.

Hubert "Mac" McLaren, 88, of Harrington, DE, died Oct

28. Mac helped his father on their 300-acre Prince Edward Island farm plowing the fields with horses as a boy. Then he spent 25 years training horses in Maine and New Hampshire before retiring and spending the next 25 years as a machinist. Finally he trained and drove in the east coast pony races.



Wyatt Jase Morrissey, 18, of Science Hill, KY, died Aug

5. He was a member of First Baptist Church and a member of Upward Bound at SCC. Wyatt recently enlisted in the United States Navy, where he scored the highest score of 96 on the Nuclear Engineer test. Wyatt was the nephew of CHHA members, Carthel and Marilyn Daulton. Carthel trained and drove Standardbreds.



Paul J. "Jim" Roberts, 86, of Wapakoneta, OH, died Nov

2. Jim owned and trained harness horses. He and his wife, Danelda, had 17 children. While raising their children, Jim helped on the farm and had a couple different jobs. He retired from General Dynamics as a millwright and welder. Paul enjoyed hunting, fishing and especially horse racing.



Patrick Rooney, Sr, 84, died Oct 29. Patrick was assistant racing secretary at Brandywine and Liberty Bell before becoming general manager at Liberty Bell. He served as president of Continental Racing Assoc. at Green Mountain and the Palm Beach Kennel Club (PBKC). Later he was CEO and Chairman of the Board for PBKC. He was the son of late Pittsburgh Steelers owner Art Rooney Sr. His brother, Timothy, was inducted to the Living Hall of Fame.


Perry E. "Buddy" Simpson, 93, of Fairfield, IL, died Oct

30. Buddy was a horseman, racing and training Standardbred horses from his Battleshoe Farm east of Fairfield. In 2002 he was inducted into the IL Harness Horseman's Hall of Fame. He was also a longtime member of the Union North Cumberland Presbyterian Church, where he served as elder and Sunday school teacher for many years. Buddy's son, Dirk Simpson, races at

the Meadows in Pennsylvania and is very supportive of Pastor Joe's ministry there.

Vincenzo Villante, 92, of Margate, FL, died Oct. 30.

Vincenzo was born in Italy. As a young man, he traveled to Venezuela to work as a mason. He came to the United States in 1954. He worked as a mason in New Jersey. In 1972 he retired and moved to Margate FL. He owned harness horses that raced at Pompano. He was a man of faith and a parishioner of St. Vincent's Catholic Church



in Margate. His daughter and son-in-law, Jake and Rosie Huff, are CHHA members. Jake and Rosie own horses, and Jake is a driver and trainer.

Patrick Mitchell "Mitch" Vincent, 68, of Washington CH, OH, died Nov 4. Mitch was an owner trainer and driver of Standardbreds. His family has been in the business of harness racing for three generations. He was a retired routeman and supervisor for Nichols Bakery.
