# Cashing Big Tickets

Standing on the rail outside the winner's circle, you can't believe the fractions your longshot is posting. Surely, he's doomed. The driver never should have cut the mile, let alone maintain such a pace. Oh well, it was a longshot anyway. You thought he had a chance and, if you cashed a big ticket, you would have been able to buy that home you want.

The fellow on the middle cross died after shouting out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46 NIV). The skies darkened. There was a big earthquake. A few of the crucified's followers were there by his cross. Others watched from the distance. What was happening? They believed in this man. He was their hope (Matthew 27:51, Mark 15:40-41).

Rounding the upper turn, your horse is still hanging on but it is not looking good. Several horses are moving to the outside and gaining on you coming down the stretch. You are neck-in-neck, then nose-to-nose. It could be a dead heat. At least you would get something.

"The earth shook, the rocks split, and the tombs broke open. [...] When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified and exclaimed, 'Surely He was the Son of God!" (Matthew 27:51-52, 54 NIV).

Wow! Your horse broke free and is flying! The photo finish flashes. You won!!!!

Three days later Mary Magdalene and another Mary went to the tomb and found it empty with an angel sitting by the open entrance. "The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know

that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as He said" (Matthew 28:5-6 NIV). "The women hurried away from the tomb, afraid vet filled with joy, and ran to tell His disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them. [...] Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see Me" (Matthew 28:8-10).





Michelle Mae Conard, 61, of Nicholasville, KY, died Jan 27. Michelle's husband, David Conrad, is a blacksmith in Lexington, KY. He also shod horses at Hoosier Park.



Owen Lawrence Julius, 81, of Millstone Township, NJ, died Feb 6. Owen shared a love of horses with his family by trail-riding and racing. He owned, trained and drove harness horses and also was a licensed Presiding Jusge for the fairs. He served



Terry Lewis, 76, of Townsend, DE, died Jan 31. Terry enjoyed a long career training Standardbreds at Rosecroft Raceway. After a break to help help with her family in Saratoga Springs, she returned to Delaware where she cheered on her daughter, Diane, and her horses.



Michael A. Lotano, 85, of Glenville, NY, died Feb 6. Michael owned, trained and drove Standardbreds. Over the years, he worked at many independent pharmacies and regional chains, and he owned Albert's Drugs in Colonie, NY, from 1978 to 1988.



Charles E. Marsh Jr, 75, died Jan 29. Charles was a lifelong horseman who also spent time as a Rehoboth Beach Detective. He established his own stable at the family farm where he raised, trained and raced his horses. In 1992, he

and raced his horses. In 1992, he leased Angler's Restaurant on the Lewes Canal, which he renovated and operated successfully, and then sold to Irish Eyes.



Stanley W. Miller, 77, of Etna Green, IN, died Feb 1. Stanley was an accomplished Standardbred trainer. He owned 156 Standarbreds at the time of his death. He was a longtime faithful member of Fairview Mennonite Church.



John Roberts Reese, 73, of Corning, IA, died Jan 29.

John was a well-known driver and trainer in Iowa. He was inducted into the Iowa Harness Horseman's Hall of Fame in 2009. His late father, Raymond, raced harness horses and his brother, Jim, still does. John earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in history from Northwest Missouri State.



George Reider, 64, of Sacramento, CA, died Feb 15. George was a longtime Standardbred owner and trainer. His sister and brother-in-law, Colleen and Bob Rosen, got him into the business.

Howard Beau Ridenour, 94, of Waynesfield, OH, died

Feb 3. Howard was the proud founder of Howard Starting Gates, which for many years, manufactured virtually all mobile starting gates around the world. Today his gates are in use at many tracks, including the Meadowlands. According to Dan Coon who worked as a starter along with this father and brother, Chuck and Greg, Howard "has had an enormous influence on the sport."



Guy Franklin Rion, 69, died Jan 25. Guy hit the road with the Standardbred industry's Grand Circuit after high school and worked for

Glen Garnsey and Bill Popfinger. In the mid-1980s to early-1990s, he operated a successful stable of Standardbreds. In 1984 he embarked upon a successful career as a senior equine sales representative at Milburn Equine/ Webster Veterinary/Patterson Companies.



Jerry Silverman, 88, of Lake Worth Jerry, while growing up in the Bronx, often looked for ways to sneak into Yonkers Raceway. Eventually he became an owner, trainer and driver of Standardbreds and at the age of 31 won the 1966 Pacing Triple Crown. He was inducted into the Harness Racing



Hall of Fame. In a 2019 *Hoof Beats* interview he said, "I just got lucky, that's all. All I can say is that I tried my best, did what I could. I was a little Bronx boy that had no experience, and luckily, I had the right people with me. That's basically it in a nutshell."

Daryl Scott Bier, 57, of Endicott, NY, died Jan 24. Daryl is a second-generation harness horseman. He made his career training and driving Standardbred racehorses beginning in 1987. He raced at

tracks on both coasts of the United States, before establishing a home base on the Delaware circuit. He was forced to retire in 2021 as a result of complications from a fractured pelvis and spine sustained in a 2014 racing accident at Pocono Downs.
