# **Hope**By Chaplain Lee Alphen

A runaway horse escaped heavy rains by ducking into Sydney, Australia's Warwick Farm railway station. Security footage showed the horse, who appeared to be waiting for a train, jogging up and down the platform. Social media users did not think it was the horse's first rodeo suggesting the horse was only horsing around. The horse did seem relieved when someone with a halter showed up and led him up the ramp into a waiting trailer (Epoch Times Bright, 4/20/2024),

Responding to a racket in the dumpster behind the building of an Omaha accounting firm, one of the partners found a puppy in distress. The puppy's head was completely covered with duct tape. His front and back legs and tail were also duct taped. The Nebraska Humane Society sedated him and removed the duct tape and food debris clinging to him. Freed of his restraints, he perked right up and began wagging his tail. Leo and his owner were happily reunited thanks to his microchip (Epoch Times Bright, 4/22/2024).

We read in 1 Corinthians 13:13 that faith, hope, and love continue on into eternity and that the greatest of these is love. Andrew Wommack points out in one of his teachings that, since hope comes after faith and just before love in this passage, it appears hope is more important than faith. Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations (Romans 4:18). What do we hope for?

Our imaginations are always at work. We can fill them with negative thoughts or positive ones. It is our choice. When we watch ungodly

programming on TV, we start our imaginations going down the wrong path. I often have to turn off the news before it brings on negative thoughts. Our country is going through turmoil right now. I believe the most important things I can do to help us get on the right track are to vote for godly candidates and pray, believing God has our backs.

Jesus taught in parables, forming pictures with His words to help people understand His messages. When we meditate on the scriptures, we often form pictures and even videos in our mind's eye. That is, we can watch the story unfold in our imagination. Just reading God's word without really thinking about the story or the message being conveyed may just be reading a bunch of words. When we talk to God in prayer, do we visualize what we are saying, what we are asking for or discussing with God? Or is our mind somewhere else?

God told Abraham, "I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore" (Genesis 22:17 NIV). From then on, Abraham had a vision of God's promise that he could see in his imagination. At night he could look up at the stars and during the day he saw the sand surrounding him.

When I say the word "horse," what image do you conjure up? Now if I say "pacer," does the image in your mind add hopples to the horse? What flavor do you see when I say ice cream? Do the words "nice juicy steak" pique your interest? When we are focused, it helps us to think in pictures.

In Genesis we read, "The Lord saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that

every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time. The Lord regretted that He had made human beings on the earth" (Genesis 6:5-6 NIV). The things people were thinking about upset God enough to send the flood. Thankfully God found Noah to be a righteous man who walked faithfully with God and instructed him to build the ark to save himself, his family and every kind of animal.

We don't want God to find us focused only on all the evil that is going on in our world today. There is plenty of good in our own lives, families, country and around the world. What do we pray for? How do we pray? Spending time with God is paramount. Don't be shy. Let's give our imaginations over to God. Let God give us the vision in every circumstance. Dream and dream big. "Where there is no vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18 KJV).

Is there turmoil in your life? Stress in your home? Sickness in your family? Financial problems? Or are you seeking God's guidance to help you better do His will? We surely don't want to be dreaming about the negative aspects of any of our struggles. That would be dreaming about the work of the devil. Instead, with God's help we can bring up a picture in our minds of success in each of these instances and focus on God answering our prayers mightily.

I don't know if horses dream of winning races or dogs dream of protecting their people. However, I do know I want to dream of working with God to **Keep Christ Alive in Harness Racing!** I pray God gives me the vision to succeed in everything He sent me here to earth to do. How about you?


Remember hope will not be disappointed (Romans 5:5). Let's be ready when God calls us home.



Earl R. Bean, 87, of Saratoga, died May 25. Earl enjoyed a long and successful career as a Standardbred owner, trainer and driver at Saratoga where he became a well-known and respected figure in the racing community. He was a passionate outdoorsman who also loved golf. He was inducted into the Saratoga Hall of Fame in 2010.

Carmen Cappotelli, 83, of Caledonia. NY, died June 1. Carmen began a career in the drywall business. Then he opened up a stable at the Caledonia Fairgrounds where he started training, racing and breeding horses. In addition to racing in NY Sire Stakes, Carmen loved racing at the county fairs.



Irene was a school teacher before marrying Dr Howard Gill. His career took them from Kansas to Indiana, Michigan and Caselton Farms and Louisville before building Pine Bush Equine in the NY Hudson Valley. Irene was an integral part of the veterinary and harness horse business and has always been the solid loving rock of her family. She had the blessing of her Christian faith in Jesus Christ and served as a



Dr. Vernon Carmichael James, 81, of Campbell Hall, NY, died May 28. Dr James owned, trained and drove harness horses. He served his country during Vietnam War as a member of the 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions. As a Green Beret in the 501st Recon, he was awarded two Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart for his bravery and was tortured as a prisoner of war. He earned doctorates in Veterinary Medicine, Pathology and Toxicology and had a distinguished career as a research scientist and a respected professor at Lincoln University. Gerald Latessa Sr, 92, of The Villages, FL, formerly of Cleveland, OH, died recently. Gerald, Sr and his son, Gerald, Jr, owned and trained horses, based mainly at Northfield Park and the Lake County fairgrounds in Painesville, OH. He also worked for Lincoln Electric. Larry Mayhew, 79, of Windsor, Ontario, died recently.

Larry was a big support for the small local race track Leamington (Lakeshore Horse Racing Association). He and his wife Ellie spent countless volunteer hours helping with renovations when it reopened. He loved the horse races and spent many days at the track with his family. Over the years he owned










horses and even jogged one or two. Robert Scarr, 77, of Asbury, NJ, died June 17. Robert was a one-time member of the Macau Trotting Club and he trained and drove some winners at the Meadowlands. He was also involved in many artistic endeavors, was a Chinese antiques dealer and a passionate guitarist. James W. Schulte, 78, of Sadieville, KY,

died May 30. Jim had a passion for horses and loved to

race Standardbreds with his wife and family. He enjoyed spending time at the Red Mile with his friends and family and in the summertime, Jim and his family often spent time at the lake on his pontoon, "Serene." He made a living in the screen printing and embroidery business for over thirty years and was the owner of Sew Fast and Country Embroidery. Jim was a member of Ss. St. Francis



died January 31. Lucy was passionate about harness racing. She and her husband, Carl, owned and operated Shirley Stables from their farm in rural Converse and maintained stables at the Converse Fairgrounds for decades. Lucy was recognized as an early pioneer in the elevation of women in harness racing. She was retired from the Oak Hill United School Corporation.
