Template for Prayer By Chaplain Lee Alphen

Communicating

Our horses don't speak English. We speak to them anyway. We offer treats and scratch their favorite spots. We spend time with them and take them for walks. We communicate with our horses in many ways.

Jesus left a template with His disciples teaching us how to pray. He taught those gathered around Him then and us now the Lord's Prayer. This beloved prayer provides insight on how to talk with God who knows our needs better than we know them ourselves.

In this article I offer some reflections on the first few phrases of the Lord's Prayer to help you focus as you pray it, meditate or talk to God in your own words. We will continue with the rest of the prayer in a future newsletter.

Give thanks and praise

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name" (Matthew 6:9 NIV) is the beginning of how Jesus taught His disciples to pray. When we call upon God, the psalmist instructs us to "enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise; give thanks to Him and praise His name" (Psalm 100:4 NIV).

Yes, I know, sometimes we are praying because things are not going well. Someone may be sick or dying or in trouble or there may be financial or relationship issues. Even in these circumstances, it is good to thank God and praise His holy name first. It puts us in a better frame of mind to pray, recognizing that God has already indeed blessed us and helps us to anticipate a favorable answer to our prayer.

When I pray with people, I always

begin by thanking God for them and specifically mentioning something good about them for which I am thankful. Remember, every good and perfect gift comes from God (James 1:17).

According to Colossians 3:17, we're to thank God in every word and action: "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (NIV). Speak every word in gratitude, and do everything with a thankful heart.

The greatest treasure

The prayer goes on, "Your kingdom come" (Matthew 6:10 NIV). "The kingdom of God has come near" (Mark 1:15 NIV) are the first words Jesus says in Mark's gospel. Jesus compares God's kingdom to a pearl so valuable a merchant would sell everything to acquire it, and a person finding a treasure hidden in a field would spend every last penny to buy it. Jesus points out that whatever our treasure is, God's kingdom, which is like a tiny mustard seed, the smallest of seeds, that grows and expands welcoming everyone that comes to it, is inconceivably better. Our faith begins small, but as it grows and blossoms, the kingdom of God comes alive in us and around us (Matthew 13:44-46), (Luke 12:33-34). God's will

"Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10 NIV). Jesus came to teach us to love and He set an awesome example of living life to the fullest. His most important teaching was to love God and one another which He said is the summation of all the law and the prophets. This includes The Ten Commandments (Matthew 22:37-39).

"God is love" (1 John 4:16 NIV). Heaven is full of God's love, leaving no



room for death or mourning or crying or pain or sickness. When we pray for God's will to be done on earth as it is in heaven, this is what we ask for. Understanding and living the message of love in the Bible helps us to work towards this goal.

How to use this template

We may not be on the same page as God yet. However, we always have His attention. He said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5 NIV).

William "Dean" Brickell, 70, of Rochester Mills, PA, died Aug 19. Dean owned, trained and drove Standardbreds. He raced at the county fairs and at the Meadows. He was a teacher of remedial math and reading. Harold Jay Gerhardt, 89, of Richmond, VA, died Aug 17. Harold continued his parents' passion for horses and had a special interest in harness racing. He earned the title of Kentucky Colonel for his 36 years in the USTA licensing department. He lived across the street from the Delaware County Fairgrounds and enjoyed daily trips to the fair. JoAnn (Jodi) Kirkpatrick, 91, of New Holland, OH, died Sep 7. Jodi and her husband, the late Kenny Kirkpatrick, raised, trained and raced their own horses. They also were actively engaged in farming. Jodi was a legal secretary, a relief postmistress and spent over 40 years as a presiding judge for the West Holland election board. She was a longtime member and Sunday school teacher at her United Methodist Church. Her son, Kenny, owns, trains, drives and breeds harness horses.

Michael Joseph Kravchak, 47, died Sep 5. Michael was

a driver/trainer at Scarborough Downs in the 2010s. He made guest appearances as the track announcer at Scarborough and served as trackside MC during the 2012 Maine Sire Stakes finals. He was a realtor. His faith played a central role in his life



Frank C. Kuenning, 89, died Aug 14. Frank was the former co-owner and manager of Post Printing which was one of the owners of Horseman Publishing Co. which published The Horseman and Fair World magazine and founded harnessracing.com. Post also prints many of the Standardbred sale catalogs. Frank, along with his partner, the late Glenn Thompson Sr., was a strong supporter of harness racing and bullish about its future. Ruleen Ruth (McCallum) Lilley, 64, of Dutton, Ontario,

died Aug 4. Ruleen grew up on a farm where she assumed all the duties of farm life. Later, working at Mac Lilley Farms she married Jeff Lilley. They raced horses all around North America before taking on the responsibilities of the breeding end of the business. Ruleen was a director for Standardbred Canada and a director and chair of West Elgin Mutual Insurance.



Heather MacMaster, 37, of Westmoreland, NY, died Aug 5. Heather liked horses and horse racing. She owned three Standardbreds. At one time she was employed as a bus driver.

Kathleen Jane "Kathy" Mattison, 75, of Hinsdale, NH, died Aug 19. Kathy owned, trained, drove and bred Standardbreds. She was one of the sport's first female drivers. She worked as a machine operator.



Retta J. McNeil, 85, of Charlotte, MI, died Sep 5. Retta and her husband, Glenwood, raised and raced Standardbred horses for many years. Retta was an elementary school teacher and math consultant. Robert "Bob" A. McIntosh, 71, of Windsor, Ontario, died Jul 28. Bob began his career in horse racing with his family's stable. He became a trainer and breeder. He was inducted into the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame and



Dossie Lee Minor, 69, died Aug 12. Dossie owned, trained, drove and bred harness horses. He was an entrepreneur with integrity and honesty who loved the horse racing. He accepted Christ as a Baptist.

the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Dixie Lee Russell, 83, of Pinckney, MI, died Aug 17.

Dixie lived on a farm with her husband, Paul. She will be remembered as a very social and active lady who loved to travel. The family never fully recovered from a 2019 fire that destroyed their barn killing seven horses. She was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church. Dixie and Paul were CHHA members.



Chuck Simon, 57, of Saratoga, NY, died Sep 8. Chuck briefly served as assistant racing secretary at Yonkers during the early 1990s. Later he had a successful training career in the Thoroughbred industry.

Norman L. "Bud" Thompson, 88, of Arcadia, IL, died Aug 8. Bud raised and raced harness horses as an owner, trainer, driver and breeder. He served as a presiding judge at the fairs and a paddock judge. Bud was also an active member of the Baptist Church.

Sharyn Wasiluk, 77, of Tampa, FL, died Aug 3. Sharyn

began her racing career as a groom then was a pony girl and a trainer. She and her husband, Peter, worked side by side in their Thoroughbred stable for over 40 years. She served on the board of directors for the HBPA at Tampa Bay Downs. She was highly



involved in the Racetrack Chaplaincy and served as President of the Tampa Bay Downs chapter.

Dr. Alan Frank Weisenberg, 77, of Columbus, OH, died Aug 27. Dr Weisenberg was an emergency room physician. He owned and bred Standardbreds, and his passion was harness racing. He often told friends that he had attended the Little Brown Jug at the Delaware County Fair for 54 straight years. He was a longtime member of Temple Beth Shalom in Columbus, Ohio.
