### You Are Well Bred

Who does your horse take after? With the big sales behind us, the season for breeding and foaling is right around the corner. It's time to pore over pedigrees. We look back through the generations for preferred bloodlines. Bill Donovan, a well-known breeder who frequents the sales, told me three generations usually satisfies yearling buyers though sometimes they go back further. Breeders go back six, seven and even eight generations.

The gospel of Matthew begins, "This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham: Abraham was the father of Isaac" (Matthew 1:1-2 NIV). Fourteen generations later Jesse becomes the father of King David (Matthew 1:6). Twenty-eight generations after David we read, "and Jacob [was] the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah" (Matthew 1:16 NIV).

David was a man after God's own heart, and Abraham is frequently referred to as "God's friend," a title highlighting the special intimacy and trust between them (2 Chronicles 20:7, Isaiah 41:8 and James 2:23).

While production and fertility are important, Bill says, "good stallions 'stamp' their foals. That is, the foals have the same look, body type and attitude—and, hopefully, speed and manners on the track. It's often a concern, when a stallion is a 'bad actor' on the track, that they pass that on, and many breeders and/or yearling buyers will be wary." Bill also said, "the maternal line founder's family often has certain traits that pass through all the generations." Of course, traits of both

parents are passed on.

Mathew's genealogy presents Jesus as the Messiah prophesied in the Old Testament and King David's heir through Joseph, his adoptive father, as well as through his mother, Mary. Some of Jesus' ancestors had scandalous pasts. Matthew includes these relatives, and also gentiles and women such as Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba in his genealogy. This signifies that all people are important to God. No one is denied God's love or a place in His family.

All Standardbreds trace their lineage back to the English Thoroughbred, Messenger, and to his son Hambletonian. "God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them" (Genesis 1:27 NIV). So we know that God is the Father of all people. We all have good breeding.

The Hambletonian line includes some bad actors and poor performers who are shunned when they don't race well enough or are too difficult to handle. Sometimes, when a new owner takes them, they respond better and enjoy a good future. Others however, run out of chances and are abandoned. Thank God for the horse adoption programs that provide a safety net for some.

God does not abandon His people. He never stops loving them and giving them chances right up until their time on earth ends. They have all that time to accept God's love and turn to Him. They are never abandoned. In fact, this month we celebrate the birth of God's Son, Jesus, whom God sent to us to show us the way back to Him. Unfortunately, some still walk away from God and all His blessings. They abandon Him.

He began his veterinary career at Foxboro Raceway before relocating to South Florida where he worked at Pompano Park and continued to care for horses throughout the state.

**Everett P. Crowe**, 93, of Eaton, OH, died Sep 20. Everett drove and trained horses for more than 30 years. He also worked for General Motors – Delco Moraine for 30 years.

James Kent "Chip" Hastings, 77, of Delaware, OH, died Oct 10. James worked for the USTA for 32 years over two stints. Beginning in 1976, he served as director of officials through 1984. In 1992 he became the liaison officer, a post he held until his retirement in 2017. He also served as presiding judge at many racetracks.

Robert N. (Bob) Highfield, 92, of Washington Court House, OH, died Aug 26. Bob was manager of the Pure Oil Bulk Plant and Case Power and Equipment before becoming a realtor and broker. He retired as Fayette County's first Economic Development Director. He also worked for Midland Acres, pursuing his love of horses. After retirement, Bob spent most of his time tending to his award-winning pure-bred, Dorset Sheep.
