Prepare to Win the Race of Life

Jogging and training prepares our horses for the races. We start out easy and gradually increase the mileage and training times depending on the horse. Generally, Standardbreds jog three to five miles most days and train in between races. Thoroughbred workouts are much shorter.

“Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil” (Matthew 4:1 NIV). He fasted for forty days, praying and spending time with the Father. This was a period of preparation for his earthly ministry.

Parents and teachers prepare children to succeed in life by challenging them to be all God made them to be. My brothers and I each had a list of daily chores and were expected to help out in other ways. Our parents also taught us to water ski and encouraged us with other exciting opportunities for us to grow and experience new and stimulating challenges. This was all very good for us and helped us all develop good work ethics.

I believe our grandparents were the ones most involved in nurturing our faith. Our teachers and professors expected us to study, complete assignments and learn the work they presented. Towards the end of my formal studies, it occurred to me that the purpose of education was to learn how to learn in different disciplines. There is always something more to learn. We never really finish our time of preparation in any field.

Jesus learned the scriptures well and was able to use them in His battle against the evil one. Twice the devil

challenged Jesus, questioning His identity as the Son of God. “If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread.” Jesus answered, ‘It is written: “Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.”’ (Matthew 4:4 NIV).

Then the devil told Jesus that if He was the Son of God to throw Himself off the top of the temple, reminding Him of the scripture that said God would send His angels to help Him. “Jesus answered, ‘It is also written: “Do not put the Lord your God to the test.”’ (Matthew 4:6-7 NIV).



Paul Joseph Abraytis, 72, of Broadview, IL, died Dec 4. Paul was an avid harness racing fan who trained Standardbreds and worked with horses most of his life. During retirement he enjoyed spending time outside working around his farm, driving his tractor and spending quality time with his family and beloved animals.



Alba Luz (Lucy) Bernardi, 80, of Carleton, MI, died Oct 10. Lucy and her husband, Elpidio (Junior), raised their family and ran a racehorse business side by side. She built a beautiful life rooted in love, family, and faith. Lucy was known for her kindness.



Ben Bolon, 79, of Washington, PA, died Dec 9. Ben began racing horses with his dad at Ohio fairs then followed his father to the Meadows. Ben established himself as a talented driver, picking up catch-drives to win three straight Meadows driving titles in the 1970s, while also operating his own public stable.

Dr. Malcolm J "Jim" Borthwick Jr, VMD, 84, died Oct 21. Jim started his career with harness horses at Yonkers and Roosevelt Raceways. He and his wife, Mary, moved to New Hope, PA, in 1971, and he continued his career as an equine veterinarian. He enjoyed driving his own horses, many of which he bred and trained.



Raymond M. Farmer, 69, of Toledo, OH, died Oct 17. After high school, Ray worked for Steel Castings before dedicating his life to owning, training, and racing horses. He was recognized several times as "Top Trainer" at the former Raceway Park in Toledo.



Gary Gregory, 81, of Churchville, NY, died Oct 22. Gary started working around horses with his father. Eventually he started his own public stable and was a premier trainer.

Paul Douglas Gsell, 87, of Crumpton, MD, died Nov 17. Paul started working at Winfield Farms as a horse handler in the stallion barn. After his retirement, he and his wife, Carolyn, owned, trained, and raced Standardbreds. He had an amazing way with horses.



Caroll Dean "C.D." Huffman, 81, of Sigourney, IA, died Nov 9. CD was always into racehorses. Along with his family he owned Huffman Racing Stables and raced horses throughout the country. He was also passionate about livestock sales and over the years he owned several sales barns. CD was a member of Sigourney United Methodist Church.







Randy Miles Williams, Sr, 69, of Pataskala, OH, died Nov 21. Horses were a huge part of Randy's life. He retired as a driver, trainer, and associate judge of Standardbreds at Scioto Downs and Dayton Raceway.



Dr. Dan Wilson, 76, of Hudson, OH, died Nov 17. Doc Wilson began his veterinary practice in 1975 at Northfield Park retiring almost 50 years later. Then he and his wife, Barbara, bought some horses and enjoyed watching them race. He received a Special Service to Harness Racing Award from the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association.



A Listening Ear

If you are a believer, you have accepted Jesus Christ as your Creator and Savior, but there is one other position or title you may not have afforded Him... Best Friend, which He very much desires to be in your life. (If you are *not* a believer, you can pull aside, invite Jesus into your heart and be born again...and that does not have to be done in a church or some meeting; it can be done at your desk, or living room, or breakfast table.)



Most all "religion" is about keeping rules and regulations; but true Christianity is about relationship -- a one-on-one relationship between you and the Creator of the universe, and that's where the awesomeness of this Best Friend position comes into play. Think about a relationship or meeting you've had recently, maybe even today, with a good friend. You both talked and you both listened to what each other had to say. I'm convinced that Jesus wants to have that same type relationship with each of us -- there's talking (we call that *praying*), but there should also be *listening* on our part. Too often, I think, we voice our requests (prayers), ending with "in Jesus' name, amen." and we're out of the throne room without ever giving the Lord an opportunity to speak. He may have the answer to our prayer or some very relevant wisdom immediately available...if we'd only take the time to *listen*.

Developing a listening spiritual ear takes practice. Most of us have been caught up in a rapid-moving, often stress-filled world that does not lend itself to "quiet time with the Lord." We have to diligently set aside time to "learn to listen." Mine is the first thing in the morning... first thing after a little wake-up exercise and a cup of java. And I must tell you that it took many mornings before I began to hear that "still small voice."

A wonderful Bible teacher and personal friend of mine, Andrew Wommack, told me years ago, "God is

always talking." We just need to develop an "always-listening" spiritual ear. That includes spending time in His word and quiet time with Him. A listening ear can change your life.

Scripture: And behold, the Lord passed by, and a great and strong wind tore into the mountains and broke the rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice (*1 Kings 19: 11, 12*).


